- Importance of Cyber security
 - Deals with protecting data against hackers
 - Fishing, password security
 - Why do we care about Cyber Security?
 - Everything is connected.
 - Money, grades, electricity.
 - What is Fishing?
 - A fake email that tries to scam you
 - From email, phone, messages.
 - Red Flags
 - Pretending to come from someone you know.
 - Look for suspicious stuff
 - Look for asking for personal information
 - Errors in text
 - Anytime Money is involved, carefully look at it. Most are red flags.
 - Password Safety
 - Number one thing you shouldn't do is reuse your password
 - If you use your password in different places, if someone steals it, they can get into other places.
 - Writing down your password, anyone can steal that password
 - Make your passwords complicated, use numbers, use characters, try to not use names or birthdates.
 - Use Smart detector indicators, dual face authentication.
 - How can you secure your online safety
 - Report when you get suspicious activity
 - Do not download software without permission

- Always ask if you do not think something is legit over email, you can ask the security department.
- Security of Witness Training
