CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING

For students interested in earning college credit for previously acquired knowledge, ESU provides a mechanism by which a student can decrease the time needed to complete a degree. An enrolled student, or a prospective student who subsequently enrolls, is permitted to earn university credits in a variety of ways. These means permit a high degree of quality control. Among them are: credit by examination and/or advanced placement as determined by CLEP tests, Advanced Placement tests, or department-developed tests; military service credit, Cambridge examinations, other approved external examinations and independent study or research problems credit. ADVANCED PLACEMENT

If you have taken advanced placement courses through high school programs, you may be eligible for advanced placement and/or credit. The advanced placement course is administered and graded by the Educational Testing Service. High schools interested in more information should contact the Advanced Placement Program, P.O. ESU accepts advanced placement exam scores in several areas and assigns pass credit rather than grades. The only fee is assessed by Advanced Placement. If you enroll in a course for which you have already received advanced placement credit, the previous credit will be cancelled.

The only fee is assessed by CLEP. If you enroll in a course for which you have already received advanced placement credit, the previous credit will be cancelled.

Earning credit in general education by means of CLEP examinations does not automatically satisfy requirements in majors or teaching fields. Each school or department within the university has different curriculum requirements and may use the scores in different ways. Students are urged to consult with division chairs on the use of these examinations.

Students requesting college credit should submit a DD214 form or Joint Services Transcript (JST) to the Registrar. Credit for service school courses will require certificates showing satisfactory completion.

CREDIT BY DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION

Several departments offer credit by examination which are similar to final examinations given in the courses. In most cases, the grade of "P" is used.
